The Office of Parking & Transportation Services, located in Turner Avenue Garage, Level 2, performs a wide variety of functions for the campus, including maintaining parking lots and garages, providing shuttle bus services, enforcing parking regulations and assigning permits to employees and students.

All vehicles parked on campus must display a valid permit unless parked in a metered space. Limited parking is available within core campus and is assigned on a first-come, first-served basis according to class standing. There is no free parking on campus. Students with vehicles on campus who choose not to purchase a parking permit will find more than 2,100 metered spaces located in areas convenient to classrooms.

Contact the parking office for shuttle schedules and permit fee information.

Parking is enforced 24 hours a day, including fire lanes, yellow curbs, disabled spaces, visitor's spaces and loading zones. The office reserves the right to tow on the first violation. Excessive violation fees are assessed to the student account after the fifth ticket, with the ticket count running from Sept. 1 - Aug. 31.

HOW DINING PLANS WORK

The number (21, 17, 14, 10 and 7) indicates how many meals a particular dining plan offers during a typical week. A week is measured from Sunday morning to Saturday night, and dining plans reset every Sunday morning. With five basic Mizzou Dining Plans and five Mizzou Gold Dining Plans available, students may select a plan that best meets their personal needs, thereby avoiding wasted meals.

Staff provide a variety of services to MU students, including individual and group therapy, crisis counseling, psychoeducational programs and workshops and consultation to anyone concerned about an MU student. Services are confidential and provided at no additional charge. Testing Services is also housed within the Counseling Center and administers a wide range of tests, including national admissions tests (e.g., GRE, TOEFL, MCAT, LSAT), mathematics and foreign language placement tests and CAAP Senior Assessment exams.

The Student Health Center (SHC) is a comprehensive health care facility accredited by the Accreditation Association for Ambulatory Health Care (AAAHC). The SHC offers primary medical care including acute illness, injury, and chronic disease management as well as men's and women's health maintenance examinations. The integrated health system includes mental health services (psychiatry and counseling psychology) and health promotion services for stress management, tobacco cessation, sexual health, nutrition education, and body image. SHC staff monitor required immunization and tuberculosis screening compliance. Access to care is available by appointment. The SHC is located in the University Physicians Medical Building (UPMB) on the corner of Hitt Street and Hospital Drive. An after-hours nursing phone line is available.

The pre-paid health fee covers some, but not all of the services available at the SHC. Students will be charged for all non-covered services; examples include all laboratory tests, splints, casts, surgical procedures, and physical therapy. These charges may be paid with cash, credit card, or charged to the student's university account. The SHC can provide assistance with filing claims for students with personal health insurance, but cannot guarantee coverage.

Services and procedures performed outside the SHC are not covered by the Student Health fee. The SHC does not maintain a pharmacy, but a University Hospital Pharmacy is conveniently located on the first floor of the University Physicians Medical Building. The University sponsors a separate Student Accident and Sickness Insurance Plan that may be purchased at the Cashiers Office in Jesse Hall within the first 30 days of classes. MU is committed to providing leadership opportunities that will allow students to learn more about themselves, the diverse individuals with whom they will interact and the communities in which they live, learn and work. Here are just a few of the exciting programs sponsored by the Center for Leadership Development:

THE LEADERSHIP CERTIFICATE PROGRAM

The Leadership Certificate Program is designed to encourage students to get involved on campus at Mizzou and to assist each student in structuring *their* Mizzou experience around their interests and career ambitions. Students will be awarded points toward earning a certificate through active involvement on-campus and in the community.

COLLEGIATE LEADERSHIP COLUMBIA

Sponsored by the Columbia Chamber of Commerce, this program takes student leaders into the community to learn about leadership and how it is manifested for community improvement in the Columbia area.

EMERGING LEADERS PROGRAM

This semester-long program recognizes and develops the leadership potential of freshman students. Participants partake in workshops, campus organizations, a community service project and social events. Participants also build relationships with upper-class leadership mentors and peers in the program.
